## **Course Objectives:**

The course refers to the interpretation of the forms of Architecture from the late 19th century to the 20th century about the socio-cultural development of each era. The main issue is the realization by students that the thought-form relationship is an interaction relationship that is not subject to logical rules and therefore free in this sense, while at the same time, each form emerges as a bodily expression of the cultural context in which it manifests itself.

#### **Learning Outcomes:**

The students through the course acquire an understanding of the defining features of the evolution of design and screen-based creative practice from the late 19th century till the end of the 20th century.
