## **Course Objectives:**

The course aims to introduce students to the forms of Art about the sociocultural development of each era covering ancient ages to the 17th century.

- Understand why people make art and why art has cultural value.
- Distinguish the relationship between descriptions and interpretations of artworks

The aim is to interpret the forms as carriers of meanings, to relate them to the collective goals of the times and their respective philosophical foundations
