Doctoral Research

In the doctoral thesis I focused on the dimensions of academic masculinities and femininities as these are negotiated by men and women academics in HE in Cyprus which has been heavily impacted by neoliberal ideals. Adopting a psychosocial approach and a combination of gender theories such as Hollway and Jefferson's theory of the defended psychosocial subject, Butler's theory of performativity and Wetherell's theory of affect, I explored gender issues regarding the ways academics negotiate neoliberal discourses creating new subjectivities which derive from neoliberal and postfeminist ideals. Since the study took place in a precarious neoliberal context, I precisely explored how academics negotiate neoliberal discourses in relation to issues of stress, anxiety and competition and how they respond to events in the social (academic) sphere that are under increasing pressure and competition and which are shown through the affective performances of the defended academics.

The exploratory research study attempted to establish the relationship of success and test risk-taking behaviour among students in higher education in Cyprus. This research resulted in a conference presentation.

The research study examined business students' perceptions regarding the use of group projects in their courses, determined the impact of certain factors on students' perceptions and investigated the relationship between group projects and preferred business subjects of college students. - English Language I for Business Students: is an English for Specific Academic Purposes course designed for first year business students. Aimed at helping students improve their proficiency in English, rendering them able to use the target language for a variety of purposes. Following an integrated skills approach, it targets the development of all four skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing. This is also a skills-based course designed specifically for students of business in tertiary level studies. It also equips students with the specialist business language they need to participate successfully within a business studies faculty. There is also a focus throughout on the key business vocabulary.
- English Language II for Business Students: is an English for Specific Academic Purposes course which aims at introducing students to the main types of academic writing. Emphasis is placed upon the elements that constitute various rhetorical writing patterns and on developing skills in writing essays in these patterns. The rhetorical patterns to be studied include process, cause-and-effect, classification, comparison-and-contrast, and argumentative writing. As academic writing relies on research produced by others, the course also highlights the importance of finding, evaluating and referring to relevant literature. Students are introduced to the conventions of quotation, citation, summarising and paraphrasing designed for first year business students. It is also of great importance to the course to render students able to communicate in English effectively. Emphasis is also given on the improvement of students' speaking and listening skills through a variety of activities such as in-class presentations and discussions as well as listening comprehension tasks.
- <u>Communication and Interpersonal Skills</u>: designed for second year college students. This course helps students develop vital communication skills to be used throughout their career. Given the complex forces in the contemporary workplace and the unrelenting pressure of global competition, employers look for candidates who have certain skills which are reinforced in this course: communication skills (both written and oral), interpersonal and team skills, intercultural and international awareness and sensitivity, Electronic media skills and professionalism. Students are also introduced to the new technologies that emerge in the business world.

- <u>Introduction to Research Methods</u>: designed for second year college students providing an understanding for research, introducing a variety of approaches and techniques of research methods, data collection and data analysis.
- <u>Dissertation I:</u> This course aims to provide students with the means necessary to undertake an effective final year research dissertation. More specifically, the unit will strengthen the understanding of students on both the purpose of intensive and independent research and the qualities needed to be a good researcher.
