

Course Content	Using mixed methods from archival research and oral history to close reading of visual and textual analysis, students critically examine a topic of their own choosing, producing a research thesis based on a clear historical perspective. Writing a history thesis offers students a unique opportunity to pursue research on a specific topic and requires students to work independently. Building on historical knowledge, writing and research skills gained in courses of the previous semesters, students focus on primary sources and pursue an original research question. Lectures, workshops and individual meetings with tutors provide a framework for the production of an original, well written essay of c.10.000 words.
