Course Content	The MBA 800 course proves the students' independent abilities to investigate an issue within the fields of business administration. The emphasis lies on the critical choice of method, the creation of a relevant theoretical frame, and an in-depth analysis of the theoretical and empirical material. Initially, the student must identify a possibility to contribute to the existing body of knowledge in a chosen subject or problem area, and make a significant and realistic effort to make this contribution. The methodology discussions must be clearly connected to the problem area and the different parts must be well integrated into a meaningful unity.
